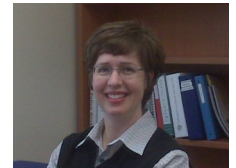
- Monday—school spirit day (wear red uniform shirt)

**Mrs. Berry’s 4th Grade Class Integrates Technology with Utah History**



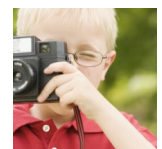
